

Devils Backbone State Natural Area





The land is adjacent to Chase Creek and can be accessed from Dugway Road off of CTH "A" south of Bagley and north of Glen Haven, WI.





Devils Backbone/ Chase Creek

Description

Devil's Backbone State Natural Area includes 126 acres of diverse Mississippi River blufflands. A steep hike up the face of the bluff will take you to the ridge top and incredible scenic views of the Mississippi River corridor. It was permanently protected by MVC in 2007 and was designated a State Natural Area by the DNR.

The site is unusual in that there is nothing but a narrow gravel road and railroad tracks between it and the Mississippi River. Consequently, it's a wild and peaceful spot. In addi-

tion to beautiful shooting star flowers, the property provides habitat for rare snails. A small, old cabin exists on the property.



"This land contains natural resources so unique and rare that nothing like it has yet been protected in the state of Wisconsin," George Howe, conservation director, said. The site includes another rare geologic feature informally referred to as "petrified waterfalls" in which algae causes minerals to form cave-type stalactites above the ground.



Stewardship

Mississippi Valley Conservancy has saved a rare Wisconsin Ice Age relic with the purchase of 98 acres along the Mississippi River, another milestone in MVC's record of achievement.

"For the first time in the entire State of Wisconsin, an algific talus slope has been permanently protected," said Tim Jacobson, MVC executive director.

An algific talus slope is an ecosystem frozen in time—a plant and animal community remnant from the Ice Age that is maintained through a rare geological formation, a system of sinkholes and subterranean ice caves that vent cold air all summer through rock fissures on the side of a bluff.



What Can I do at Devil's Backbone/ Chase Creek Bluff?

- Open to the public for hunting, fishing, canoeing, hiking, wildlife observation, nature photography and snowshoeing. (See trail map)
- Hikers are encouraged to take precautions during hunting seasons.
- ♦ Provide environmental education to area school groups.
- ♦ You can help keep our Preserve beautiful by carrying out your trash.
