About Kickapoo Bottoms

Kickapoo Bottoms is an 85-acre tract along the Kickapoo River and adjacent to the Crawford County fairgrounds. It includes scenic southern sedge meadow, wet prairie, sloughs, ponds, and floodplain forest. Open grasslands on the property provide valuable habitat for waterfowl and declining grassland nesting birds, such as meadowlarks and bobolinks. The property also provides 4,700 feet of frontage along the Kickapoo River, one of the Conservancy's most ecologically significant priority areas.

According to the Wisconsin Land Legacy Report, the Kickapoo River is described as "one of the most diverse assemblages of natural communities in the state," supports breeding populations of birds and provides habitat for many rare species of plants and animals.

Public Access

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
TRAIL MAP

Kickapoo Bottoms

(17725 State Highway 131, Gays Mills, WI—southwest of fairgrounds)

A 1.8-mile (round trip) mostly flat mowed out-and-back hike through Kickapoo River bottoms.

How to get to the property from La Crosse (approximately 47 miles from the intersection of Hwys 14 and 61 at the south end of La Crosse): Head south on Hwy 35. Pass Ferryville (31 mi), go approximately 3 more miles and turn left on Hwy 171. Go approximately 13 miles to Gays Mills. On the east side of town, turn right on Hwy 131 and drive about 1 mile to the Crawford County Fairgrounds. Park at the southwest corner near the corral.

- Start at the southeast corner of the fairgrounds and head south and then west. At 2 go around a gate.
- **3** Veer left when you reach the Kickapoo Stump Dodger Campground.
- **4** Take a side trail to the right to hike closer to the river. Rejoin trail at **5**.
- **o** Trail ends. Retrace your steps to the parking area.
